Silk Painting

Please bring the following items to the first class (the rest of the list will be discussed):

- 4 (1" x 2") furring strips or a wooden stretcher
- Stainless steel pushpins, hammer, 4 C-clamps (at least 2" deep)
- wide masking tape (2" x 3")

Consider the size of the silk painting you would like to create when choosing a wooden frame for your work.

- Dyes – Tinfix Design, Dupont and Jacquard are the best
- Brushes – a variety of sizes will help (sm., med., lg.)
- Rubbing alcohol
- Masking tape – 2 or 3 inch is best
- Stainless steel pushpins
- Paper towels
- *Gutta resist – water or spirit based
- Gutta applicator bottle
- Gutta tip – goes with applicator bottle
- White plastic palette or white ice cube tray
- Small bottle of solvent (for spirit based resist)
- *Silk – your choice
- 2 (1" x 2") firing strips cut to size – your choice
- 4 C-clamps – at least 2 1/2" or 3" deep
- Hammer
- Johnson's Baby Shampoo – rinsing only
- Eye dropper
- Plastic tub or bag to put supplies in
- Scissors
- Drawing pad and pencils, markers, pens, etc.
